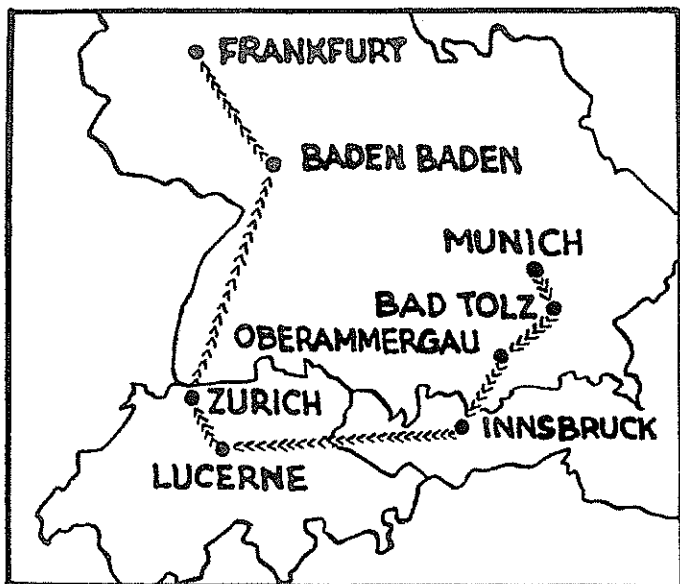

## GERMANY

**JUNE 21** - Depart Jasper via chartered motorcoach for Chicago O'Hare airport, then board Lufthansa German airline for overnight trans-Atlantic flight. Dinner and movies on board.

**JUNE 22** - Arrive Munich. Meeting services and assistance through German customs and immigration formalities, then by private motorcoach for one-hour drive to Bad Tolz where we will have a four (4) night stay at the Hotel Kolberbraeu. Dinner at your hotel.


