# Bus scheduled







# THE GERMAN-AMERICAN CLUB

The club has two primary objectives: to have fun and to promote the German Heritage.



IT'S PRIMARILY a social club with the underlying purpose of promoting the German heritage of Jasper and surrounding areas. Originally, the idea for such a club came from Dave Buehler and ran through the Jasper Chamber of Commerce, the Jasper Action Team and into the hands of about 40 charter members who met at the Jasper Haus and went to work on the idea. It took off.


Danny Wehr, the first and only president of the club—his two year term will expire soon—and his wife Linda were two of the original charter members and have worked hard to see that the club succeeded. "The first dance we had," Danny says, "generated some cash for the Strassenfest. I think we made like \$1400 for the Strassenfest. And that's how it got started."


Although the German-American Club has nothing really to do with the annual Jasper Strassenfest, the club


Below: Die Doppel Adler Musikanten, an excellent musical duo have performed at several of the Club's dances.

does promote it, and encourages members to wear their German costumes at the fest. Members also attended Huntingburg's Herbstfest, Terre Haute's Octoberfest, and the French Lick Pumpkin Parade.

There are approximately 500 members (membership fees are a surprisingly low \$5.00 per couple; \$2.50 for single.) Members come from all over—Evansville, Henderson, Terre Haute, Vincennes, Loogootee, Lafayette, Chicago and so on—and monthly meetings are held. A variety of programs are presented at the monthly meetings. Last November the Germania Maennerchor (a 35 member male singing group from Evansville) performed. In October, the Deutscherverein Kinder (children of members) sang songs in German. There have been dance instructors at the meetings, German teachers, humorists and airline executives.

And last summer, 37 members went on a tour of Germany, Austria and Switzerland. The trip was designed with enough structure to keep everyone together, but yet with enough free time that you could get off on your own if you cared to. There was a Mercedes touring bus at the group's disposal at all times.

Many of the group's members spoke some German, and in the southern areas of Germany, their dialect was easily understood. The trip was an outstanding success. Future tours are under considerations.

Two dances are held a year. German menus are used and many of the members are in costume. The dances take a lot of work, but are usually money-making propositions to a degree. With the money from the dance, the club has purchased German-American reference books for the library and has helped sponsor two local girls—Clare Wagner and Kim Hulsman—on a trip to Germany. They have also donated some money to the moving and restoration of the Gutzweiler-Gramelspacher house.


"We'll never be an organization that will generate enough money to donate to the hospital or buy street lights," says Danny. "But we definitely would be interested in promoting anything that will focus on the German heritage."

As for the future of the club, Danny hopes it stays the same. I don't want it to change. There are clubs similar to this in Indianapolis and Terre Haute and other places, but most of them are on a profit making basis. They own a club house, have restaurant facilities, that sort of thing. And once you do that, you're tied into making money, generating cash.

"For instance, in Terre Haute, they have a fine club, but their dues are about \$250 a year. They have to work. They make a lot of money in the restaurant. And the club in Evansville is the same type of thing. They're a singing

group, but I'm sure it gets quite expensive. They have a club house. Those clubs have to put in a lot of work to make their money.

"We wouldn't have the membership we do have if we had to be a working club. For we have older couples who said before they joined, 'We'd love to join if we're not going to have to do a lot of work.' They enjoy coming to meetings and seeing what is going on."

Of course, some of the members do work hard. The dances take a lot of work, and the float... that takes a lot of work, too. Last year, the club's float took first place at the Strassenfest. This year it again took first place. At the Huntingburg Herbstfest, it took first and at the French Lick Pumpkin Parade it was second place, motor division. Three entries, three awards: two firsts and a second. Not bad. But, there is work involved.

"There's a lot of hours put in just to get the float ready to travel," Danny says. "Once we get there we put in an hour getting it ready to show. Then another hour getting it ready to travel back."

Members volunteer their time for other projects as well. For instance, Jim Corn, Tom Hulsman and their wives make the signs for the club. And Danny, Linda and the club secretary, Nancy Burton, put out a newsletter once a month. Danny writes it and Linda or Nancy takes care of the mailing of approximately 250 copies.

Although he has enjoyed his tenure, Danny looks forward to his retirement as president of the club. Of

course, Linda and Danny may still be host and hostess for the Strassenfest as they were for the last two years, but he will gladly hand over his gavel to the new president.
