Treasurer Nancy Burton reported a balance of \$1259.72.



The trip committee stated they would soon have all the final arrangements for a 12 day trip to Southern Germany.

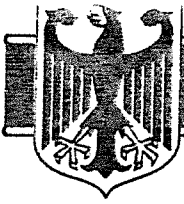
The meeting was then turned over to Norb Lueken who presented a file of points of interest in Dubois County. He also made humorous comments about many of the places.

Ron recognized the dance committee for an outstanding job.



Sat. Sept. 15 USA - EN ROUTE

Depart Jasper via charter motor coach for Louisville's Standiford Field Airport. We depart Louisville on Delta Airlines for Atlanta to connect with our 747 overnight flight to Frankfurt.

Sun. Sept. 16

FRANKFURT-RUDESHEIM-RHINE RIVER CRUISE

Arrive in the morning at Frankfurt Airport where we will be met by our German Tour Manager for assistance with customs and immigration formalities. Depart by modern, luxury touring coach for RUDESHEIM, a medieval picturesque and popular village on the Rhine. Check in at the hotel. Later this afternoon we will board our ship for an enjoyable cruise along the most scenic part of the Rhine Valley passing ancient castles, manicured vineyards poised on steep hills and the legendary Loreley Rock. Wed. Sept. 19

PFAFFENWEILER - SALZBURG

Leave early this morning for our scenic drive thru the Black Forest, passing Lake of Constance, which borders Switzerland, West Germany and Austria, before ascending the spectacular Alberg Pass with its smart villages and unlimited beauty. Tyrolean and Bavarian Alps dominate the valley scenery as we motor thru Austria's countryside of pastoral grassy slopes dotted with chalets and fashionable resorts to arrive in SALZBURG, a baroque jewel in a magnificent setting of rivers and mountains, where dinner awaits us. HIRSCHM HOTEL.

Thurs. Sept. 20 SALZBURG


A total of forty people have signed up for the trip to Germany and a waiting list for cancellations has been formed.

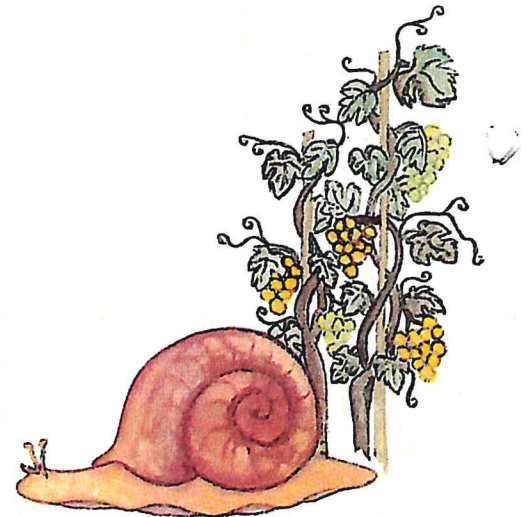

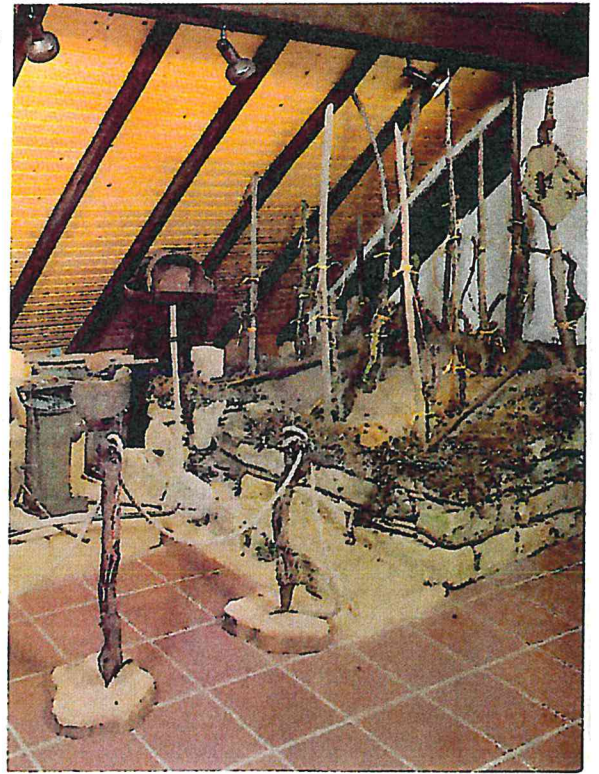

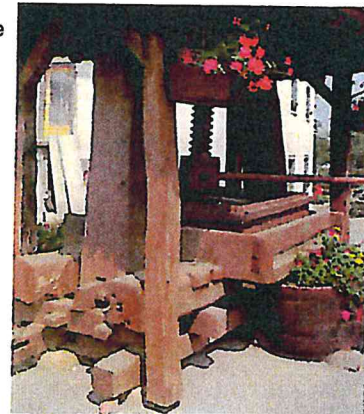
