Thanks For Hospitality in Pfaffenweiler

For the past several years, individuals from Dubois County have asked what Funds are available in Pfaffenweiler where someone could donate money to, in appreciation of an individual or the community.

There are three Funds that the community of Pfaffenweiler currently has in place.

"Sozialfond": This Social Care Fund is a non bureaucratic support fund for families and individuals of Pfaffenweiler in need. Distribution is discretely decided when needed by a committee of the City Council. "Kindergarten Spendenkonto" (Kindergarten Gift Account) This savings account is in support of the Pfaffenweiler Kindergarten beyond the annual budget. Any use of money in the account is decided by Mrs. Schaefer, Head Teacher, and her pre-school teachers. It can be used for the purchase of various items which are not in the annual budget but might become necessary.

"Jugendraumkonto": (Youth Room Account) it is similar than the Kindergarten Gift Account) The Youth Room of Pfaffenweiler does not have budgeted community money allocated to it and thus relies solely on this fund raised through private sponsors and fund raisers. It is kept in a savings account and the Guidance Counselor for the Youth Room Dominik Burghard makes the decisions together with the Youth Council how to use the money. He does report back to the Pfaffenweiler City Council.

Jasper Deutscher Verein Taking Scholarship Applications

The Jasper Deutscher Verein is offering a scholarship in the amount of \$1,000 to a German student of Dubois County. If you have a child, grandchild or know of anyone who would like to submit an application, please inform them to contact their Guidance Counselor at their school. Applications must be postmarked no later than April 1, 2011. If any questions, please contact Linda Wehr at 482-4432.

At their January Board of Directors' Meeting in 2008, the following adopted the following qualifications for the Dubois County Scholarship in the amount of \$1,000.00.

1. Completion of the common scholarship application available from the School's Guidance Office.

2. Successful completion of two years of high school German.

3. Two years of active participation in German Club or German Civic affairs in other schools.

4. Verification of enrollment in a German course at the college of their choice, or participation in an accredited German study abroad program such as the IU Honors Program.

5. Submission of a one page or less essay stating your personal qualifications and intentions.

6. GPA consideration.

7. Participation in an exchange program or hosting an exchange student.

8. Submission of two letters of recommendation from adults <u>other than</u> school personnel regarding personal character, etc.

9. The scholarship will be awarded upon verification of enrollment in German at college or acceptance into another German study abroad program such as the IU Honors Program. A \$500.00 scholarship will be given for the first semester and will be renewable for the second semester.

10. Parental membership in the Jasper Deutscher Verein will be considered.

Food for Thought

When large numbers of Germans emigrated to this country, they brought with them their cultures and foods which they adapted to the new materials and ingredients. Time and distance can flavor and change recipes in the same way it changes accents. Techniques change; seasonings vary and the original purposes are adapted to fit the new locale.

One of the recipes that these immigrants brought with them was for "schnecken" or "snails". Today variations on this recipe are beloved worldwide as the ubiquitous cinnamon roll. This recipe, which lies about half way between a traditional "Schnecken" and a modern Cinnamon Roll is from the forth coming IGHS Cookbook: German Cooking / Hoosier Style!

Schnecken / Cinnamon Rolls

Dough 3 1/3 cups bread flour ¼ cup sugar ½ teaspoon salt 1 packet dry yeast (7g) 1/3 cup unsalted butter 1/2 cup + 2 tablespoons milk 2 large eggs

Syrup

¹/₂ cup unsalted butter
2 tablespoons light brown
4 tablespoons maple syrup
3 tablespoons Karo dark syrup
1 cup walnuts or pecans

Glaze: 1 large egg 2 tablespoons milk

Filling: ½ cup sugar ¼ cup dark brown sugar 1 tablespoon cinnamon

Combine the flour, sugar, salt and yeast in a large bowl. Pour the milk into a large measuring cup, add butter and microwave for one minute on high. Beat in the eggs,

and then stir the liquids into the dry ingredients and stir together to make dough. Knead for 10 minutes by hand, or for 5 minutes using a mixer and dough hook. When it's springy and satiny, form the dough into a ball and place it in an oiled bowl, turn to coat and cover with plastic wrap. Leave it in a warm place for 1 hour or until doubled in size.

Using an electric mixer beat the butter until light and fluffy. With the mixer on low, slowly add the sugar, maple and Karo syrups. Spoon about one tablespoon of the syrup into the bottom of each cup in a 12-cup muffin pan, then add tablespoon of chopped walnuts or pecans to each cup.

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. When the dough has doubled in size, punch it down, place on a lightly floured work surface and knead once or twice. Roll the dough out to form a large rectangle, about approximately 12" by 24", with the long side closest to you. Whisk the egg and the milk together in a small bowl, then brush the dough with this mixture using a pastry brush.

Mix the filling ingredients in a small bowl and sprinkle over the dough, leaving about $\frac{1}{2}$ " margin all around. Roll the dough, starting on the long side closest to you to form a long loaf. Cut into 12 even pieces, and place one piece on its side on top of the nuts and syrup in the muffin pan. Cover with a dish towel and allow rolls to rise for 20 minutes. Bake for 20 – 25 minutes, or until golden brown. Remove from the oven and cover with an oversize piece of parchment or waxed paper and a cookie sheet. Using oven mitts, turn the whole thing upside down. Remove the muffin pan and scrap out the remaining nuts or syrup. (taken from the Spring 2011 IGHS Newsletter)
