#### 2022 Teacher Exchange Update

Ross Halvorsen, German Teacher at Jasper High School, will be our first teacher exchange participant! Ross will be traveling to Germany the first of June after school is out in Jasper and teach at Staufen Gymnasium while they are still in school. Then, while in Germany

from June 12<sup>th</sup> to July 5<sup>th</sup>, Ross will meet and chaperone the student exchange from Jasper, and then return to Jasper in early August.

Ross will work with the Pfaffenweiler Sister Cities Committee and the Staufen Gymnasium to help facilitate a teacher exchange/stay in Jasper as early as August 2022 once Jasper schools are back in session, but prior to their start of school in Germany in September.

There are many details to be worked out, however like the artists exchange, we are happy that Ross is willing to take this first step to establishing a teacher exchange between our two cities!

#### Partnership 37<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Trip

The Jasper Partnership Commission and Sister Cities of Jasper are working on the details for the trip. At this time, we estimate 18 people will be going along on the trip, however there is estimated to be an additional 6 to 8 people who will be joining up with the end of the trip in Pfaffenweiler for the celebration.

#### Die Jugend

We're all set to go on the German Exchange this summer and I am in the process of booking youth hostels and activities for the week we are on our own (in Rothenburg and Munich) before we arrive in Staufen/Pfaffenweiler to meet up with student partners and host families with whom our JHS students will stay for the remainder of the trip.

The plan is still to bring 20 students to Indianapolis on a field trip to the Athenaeum for a tour of the building, educational activity, and lunch at the Rathskeller. We then head to the Indiana Historical Society to visit the Eva Kor exhibit currently on display. And here's a quote from the Society: "The exhibit tells the remarkable story of Eva Mozes Kor, who survived Auschwitz as a child and the experiments of Dr. Joseph Mengele, and grew up to be one of the most influential Holocaust educators and activists in the world. She ignited a global manhunt for Mengele, organized other survivors, and educated millions about what happened during the Holocaust and about her vision of empowerment and forgiveness. Exploring how Kor's life and legacy teach us about the horrors of the Holocaust, the realities of antisemitism and the power of an individual to make change, the exhibit includes never-before-seen artifacts and images. original film footage from award-winning documentarian Ted Green and several dynamic interactive elements. like a virtual reality experience that transports visitors to Auschwitz and includes Eva's own voice recounting her experiences there."
