#### Die Jugend

During World War I, because of anti-German sentiment, Indianapolis decided to change the name of the building from Das deutsche Haus to the Athenaeum (honoring a Greek goddess was less problematic). The building houses a YMCA and "remains true to the 'sound mind in a sound body' ethos of its freethinking German founders." All participants from both JMS and JHS really enjoyed the field trip that included a visit to the Eva Kor exhibit at the Indiana Historical Society.

A member of the Jasper community, Daniel Conrad who graduated from Earlham College in German, came to talk to all of my classes in March about his exposure to the German language and his experience working for the American Council on the Teaching of Forreign Language (ACTFL) and in particular in the administration of language proficiency assessments. He told my students that they do not need to learn the gender of nouns, which caused a bit of a revolt, but I have to agree that correct grammar is secondary to successful communication.

I have been in touch with Tell City Pretzels since they have started perfecting their recipe for soft pretzels here in Jasper and in the next few weeks I plan to have fresh pretzels delivered to my German classes, so that everyone has the opportunity to make a Butterbrezel rather than dipping the pretzel into nacho cheese sauce.

We are on paper type 13 (out of 18) to practice using high quality paper with the fountain pens and one of my students said "This is such an enjoyable experience, writing on this paper." Last week I also passed out German pencils and erasers to my JMS class, so that they try out using a high quality HB pencil that does not have an eraser on the end of it.

We just held our last Gruppe 19 German Exchange fundraiser at Buffalo Trace Golf Course and we are almost all set to leave on the trip in June. We have a lot of exciting things planned for this trip including a day in Rothenburg ob der Tauber and we can't forget to try, maybe after our visit to the Lindt Chocolate Museum in Zurich, a popular Swiss carbonated soda made with milk.

Projects serve as vessels for area spirit

Sixty-one people will travel from here to Pfaffenweiler, Germany, next week to celebrate the communities' partnership as sister cities. Dozens of others will make the trip in spirit.

They will be making the trip through a wall-hanging they pieced and quilted, through a history book they compiled and through videotaped greetings.

#### The quilt

Kathy Hilger enjoys quilting. So does her mother-in-law, Bärbel Hilger, of Pfaffenweiler.

When Kathy came across a pattern with the double name of Indiana Puzzle and Snail Trail, her thoughts immediately turned from her Hoosier homeland to her husband's hometown, in Germany's Snail Valley.

She decided the pattern would be perfect to use in quilt for her mother-in-law.

With the help from five other women — Lois Kuntz, Louise Gutgsell, Sally Lechner, Patti Goepfrich, and Jane Luebbehusen — that idea evolved into using the Indiana Puzzle and Snail Trail pattern in a quilted wall-hanging for the City of Jasper to present to the Town of Pfaffenweiler on the occasion of the communities' 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary as sister cities.

Kathy and her husband, Matthias, see the dual-named patterns as a perfect illustration of the link between the two communities.

"I believe that the people of Pfaffenweiler will be absolutely excited and appreciative of the quilt. I think they will see it as a gift from the heart and not just some money thrown at a huge gift to impress them," said Pfaffenweiler native Matthias Hilger, who came to Jasper in 1987 as part of a sister cities work exchange and married Kathy Kunkel two year later.

In the border of the quilt – the blocks are eggplant purple, forest green and tan, reflecting the colors of Pfaffenweiler vineyards and stone quarried – are embroidered the names of the first 25 Pfaffenweiler immigrants who settled in Jasper.

The 14 women who did the quilting included a Gutgsell and an Eckert, two of the names embroidered in the border.

It's kind of neat to know there are still people here today with those names," Mrs. Hilger said.

The quilting alone took more than 100 hours, not to mention the piecing and cutting, she said.

#### Bilingual history

The second anniversary gift that has hundreds of hours put into it is a 44-page booklet that documents the history of the partnership. Jasper DeutscherVerein (German club) members and the Jasper Partnership Commission worked together to compile the book, and then to translate it from English into German.

Last week, 1,000 copies of the bilingual booklet were printed to distribute not only to Jasper and Pfaffenweiler residents but also to Sister Cities International, Sister Cities of Indiana, local schools and the public library. An Indiana Humanities Council grant, the DeutscherVerein and 16 additional local businesses foot the bill for the publication.

"We hope to provide a twofold tool for everyone by having this book," said Mr. Hilger, president of the Jasper Partnership Commission, a group that facilitates Jasper-Pfaffenweiler communication and activities. "First, we want to have it for the people involved, now and in the past, to read it and start talking about the past 15 years and the many years before."

"Second, we want to provide a proud display to promote this partnership and to show to the rest of Jasper, Indiana and the United States – and even the world, through Sister Cities International – that real sister cities function through the people of the communities and not just through city hall."

#### Candid camera

Patti Goepfrich has visited Pfaffenweiler three times, most recently for 17 days last September. She made the trip with her parents, Joe and Irene Eckerle.

Goepfrich and her parents won't be going to Pfaffenweiler next week, but they wanted to be part of the anniversary celebration. So Goepfrich videotaped greetings from her parents to their friends in the Snail Valley.

After that, she videotaped six other couples or individuals sending greetings, some in English but most in German. All of the greeters – Linus and Sally Lechner, Bob Steffe, Jerome "Chick" Alles, Stan and Mary Jane Krempp, Ed and Nancy Eckert and Claude and Martina Eckert – have been to Pfaffenweiler before but will not be making this anniversary trip.

"It's been a really neat project," said Goepfrich. "It was really a project from the heart."

A specially designed quilt is a gift from Jasper to its German sister city, Pfaffenweiler. The design and colors of the quilt, which uses a pattern known by the names Indiana Puzzle and Snail Trail, reflect the continuing relationship between the two communities. Local women spent more than 100 hours cutting, piecing and stitching the quilt. It will be displayed at Jasper City Hall until Thursday evening.

#### **TACO RANCH BITES**

Author: Stephanie @ Plain Chicken

Yield: 75 tarts

Prep Time 15 mins

Cook Time 10 mins

Total Time 25 mins

#### Ingredients:

- 1 lb. ground beef
- 1 (1-oz) package taco seasoning
- 1 (10-oz) can diced tomatoes and green chilies, undrained
- 2 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 1 (8-oz) bottle Ranch dressing
- 5 (15-count) frozen phyllo tart shells

#### Instructions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F.
- In a skillet, cook ground beef until no longer pink. Drain fat.
- Add taco seasoning and diced tomatoes and green chilies. Stir and cook for 5 minutes. Remove from heat.
- Combine shredded cheddar cheese, Ranch dressing, and taco meat.
- Spoon taco meat mixture into frozen phyllo tart shells. You can freeze for later at this point.
- Bake for 8-10 minutes, until cheese melts. (Add 2-3 minutes to the baking time if baking frozen tarts).




Can freeze tarts unbaked for a quick snack later.


